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TASC Central Training Description

TASC provides the staff of its after-school programs with research-supported core trainings that address varying skill levels and staff needs. Throughout the year, after-school educators can attend professional development workshops on safety, regulatory and other issues. Many of these trainings help programs meet government-mandated School-Aged Child Care (SACC) licensing requirements.

TASC sends regular training announcements to after-school program staff across New York City. To assure that training does not interfere with the operation of programs, Central trainings are generally scheduled on weekdays before 3 PM, on weekends, holidays, New York City Department of Education half days and during school vacations.

Eight times a year TASC hosts “Peer Conferences” for site coordinators. At these networking forums, program leaders support one another and share promising practices and valuable information related to after-school. Most conferences are organized around a theme, include keynote speakers and/or expert facilitators as well as training workshops.
